Monthly meeting minutes

Tuesday, April 18, 2023

Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

The regular monthly board meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Chairperson Phil Kriesel. Chair Kriesel confirmed the agenda was posted in appropriate places and the town's website.

Members present were Chairperson Phil Kriesel, Supervisors Bill Rudis, Amanda Pontell (new supervisor), Treasurer Joann Beltz, and Clerk Judy May (via Zoom). There were 18 audience member present. Roll call completed.

Supervisor Rudis made a motion and seconded by Supervisor Pontell to approve the Regular Monthly Meeting Minutes from March 21, 2023. Motion carried by voice vote.

Supervisor Rudis made a motion to accept the April 2023 Expenditures as presented. Motion was seconded by Supervisor Pontell. Motion carried by voice vote.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Beltz reported an adjusted balance of \$642,461.20.

Public Comments: None.

New Business:

1. Acknowledge Jim Engman, outgoing supervisor, and welcome new supervisor, Amanda Pontell.
2. Anthony Rio- Oneida County representative report. Not present.
3. Election news. Clerk May reported that 329 voters voted in the April 4, 2023 election. The only town race that was contested was for supervisor. Bill Rudis received the most votes at 174, Amanda Pontell was second with 158, and Jeff Otto received 104 votes. There are no more elections scheduled until 2024.
4. C.U.P. Aaron Kowles – WB66. Chair Kriesel stated that the town doesn't have much control over C.U.P. Chair Kriesel asked if the supervisors had any input. The board had no comments. No action taken. Clerk May will notify Scott Ridderbusch.
5. Discuss Town Maintenance Contract. The contract ends April 30, 2023. Chair Kriesel would prefer to contract with them again. Supervisor Rudis asked how long the contract lasts. Chair Kriesel stated he would prefer a five-year contract. Supervisor Rudis didn't see the harm in re-bidding. Supervisor Pontell asked who bid before and Chair Kriesel replied Mussons and Bowens. Supervisor Pontell stated she agreed with Supervisor Rudis to place the contract out for bid. Supervisor Rudis made a motion to put the contract out for a bid. Supervisor Pontell seconded the motion. Motion carried by voice vote.
6. Beaver Control. Oneida County looked at culverts and had two complaints in the town; Birch Bay Rd. and another area. The town has spent a lot of money cleaning out the culverts in the past year. USDA has beaver control people that can help control the culverts from clogging up. Chair Kriesel stated that it would be \$750 per year/per site and the USDA takes care of the beaver issues. Also, the USDA gets a 5-year right to entry on personal property to take care of it. He was told the current trapper for USDA is good at trapping. Chair Kriesel suggests hiring the USDA to do all beaver control. Supervisor Rudis made a motion to hire the USDA for beaver trapping. Supervisor Pontell seconded the motion. Motion carried by voice vote.

Old Business:

1. Town Roads.
 - a. Rambling Lane. Chair Kriesel signed the necessary CSM paperwork. Ted needs to stamp, sign, and file with the county. Title work needs to be done. Tabled to next month.
 - b. Road report. Chair Kriesel gave the following updates:
 - i. Over \$18,000 was spent maintaining the roads. Lots of plowing and sanding. Oneida County is only open from Monday-Thursday.
 - ii. Weight restrictions signs were placed.
2. Sand/Salt Storage Shed. Chair Kriesel requested a motion to approach the landowners adjacent to the town hall and talk about purchasing land for the town in order to build a sand/salt storage building. Supervisor Rudis made a motion to allow Chair Kriesel to approach the landowner to discuss a possible town purchase of the land adjacent to the town hall. Supervisor Pontell seconded the motion. Motion carried by voice vote.

A motion was made by Supervisor Rudis and seconded by Supervisor Pontell to adjourn the meeting at 6:23 p.m. Motion carried by voice vote.
