

Town of Woodboro Board of Supervisors

Monthly meeting minutes

Tuesday, March 24, 2026

Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

The regular monthly board meeting was called to order at 6 p.m. by Chairperson Phil Kriesel. Clerk May confirmed the agenda was posted in appropriate places.

Members present were Chairperson Phil Kriesel, Supervisors Bill Rudis and Amanda Pontell, Treasurer Joann Beltz, and Clerk Judy May. There was 1 audience member present.

Supervisor Rudis made a motion and seconded by Supervisor Pontell to approve the Regular Monthly Meeting Minutes from February 17, 2026. Motion carried by voice vote.

Supervisor Rudis made a motion to accept the March 2026 Expenditures as presented. Motion was seconded by Supervisor Pontell. Motion carried by voice vote.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Beltz reported an adjusted balance of \$471,335.37.

Public Comments: None.

New Business:

1. Beaver Contract. Chair Kriesel shared the contract from USDA-APHIS-WS with the board. The cost for animal control for 2026 is \$800. Supervisor Rudis made a motion to approve the beaver contract. Supervisor Pontell seconded the motion. Motion carried by voice vote.
2. Election News. Clerk May reported there will be an election held on April 7, 2026 from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. Two additional poll workers resigned, Augden and Jane Windelborn. Clerk May has a waiting list of potential poll workers for future elections, if needed. For now, they will work with the trained, approved poll workers. Setup and Clerk training will take place on 3/31/26 at 6 p.m. On the ballot is WI Justice of the Supreme Court, District 12 County Supervisor, and RSD School board members (3).
3. Review Remaining Funds from 2025. Clerk May reported there is \$192,984.56 left from 2025. The board discussed where to place the carryover. After discussion, Supervisor Rudis made a motion to move \$92,984.56 into the carryover reserved for the town hall and \$100,000 into the road fund. Supervisor Pontell seconded the motion. Motion carried by voice vote.

Old Business:

1. Town Roads.
 - a. Road report.
 - i. Discussed most recent large snowfalls plowing efforts. There is road damage that was done during the most recent plowing. Road work will be required to fix the potholes on various town roads.
 - ii. Supervisor Rudis reported a very large pothole on Hancock Lake Rd. Chair Kriesel asked the board members to keep an eye on it and report back.
2. Sand/Salt Storage Shed. Tabled from last month. Oneida County wants to have an appraisal done on proposed land purchase at corner of Hwy 8 and Birch Lake Rd. The board agreed to move

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forward with the potential for purchasing the lot, if the cost is reasonable to the town. Tabled to next month.

3. Loan consideration for Old Cty K Rd project. Board of Commissioners of Public Lands recommended a 5-year term with no early payment penalty. The town would pay the loan off once monies are received back from ARIP post-construction. The agreed-upon loan amount would be \$600,000. Tabled from last month.

A motion was made by Supervisor Rudis and seconded by Supervisor Pontell to adjourn the meeting at 6:26 p.m. Motion carried by voice vote.
